Horseshoe Lake has a shoreline that varies from steep and rocky to shallow and muddy with some swamp, bog, and sandy areas.

Water quality is fine for warmwater species of fish. An oxygen deficiency exists in the deeper, cooler water.

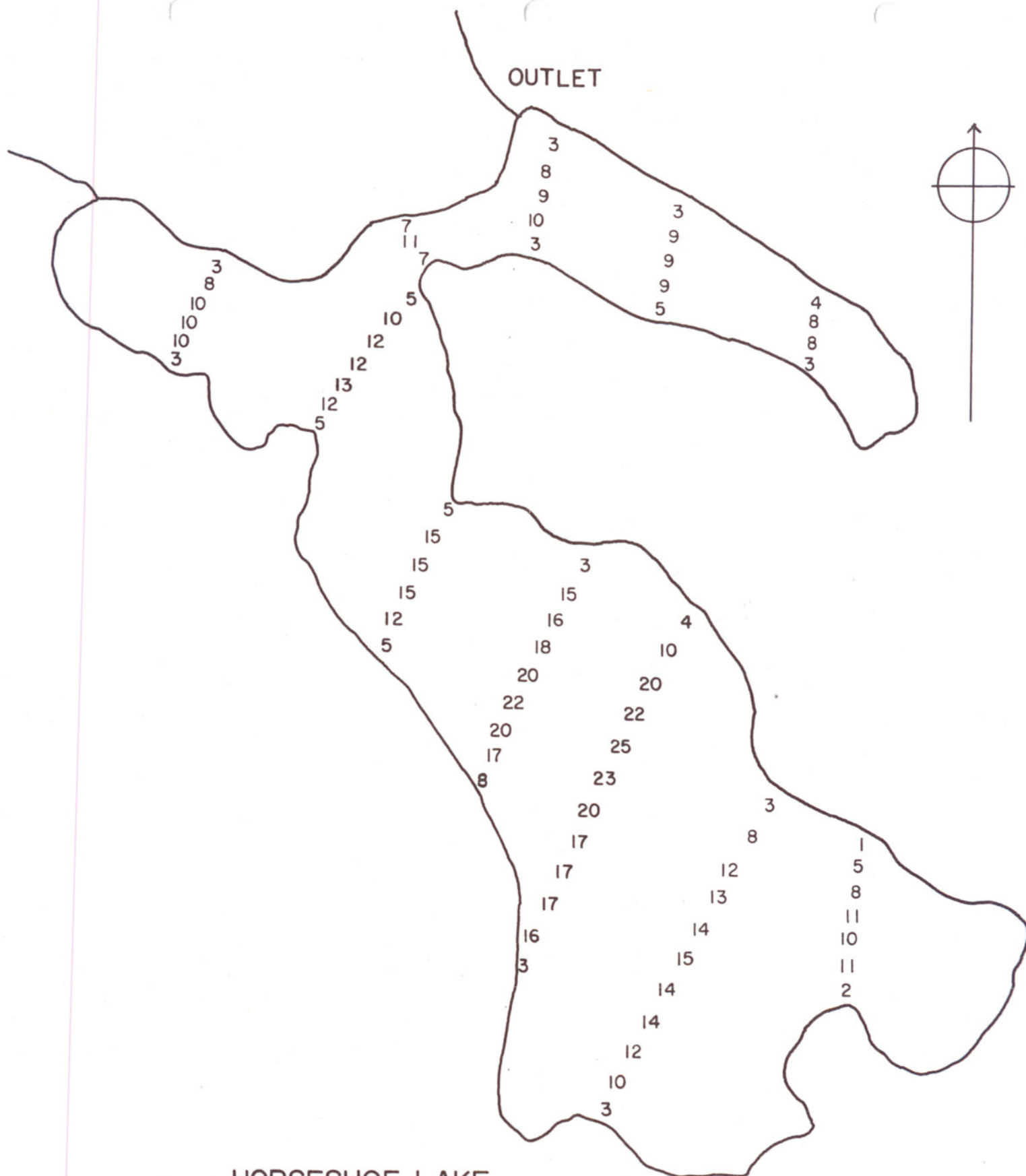
The two tributaries flow through swampy areas before reaching the lake. The remains of an old dam that had raised the lake level about two to three feet higher than its existing level are still forming a barrier on the outlet.

Stocking of coldwater species is not recommended because of the lack of habitat.

Access is from the Horseshoe Cove Road beside Lower Sysladobsis Lake or by canoe from Junior Lake.
